'We walk through high grass and over rough land. We follow a small path and arrive at an open spot. A desolate wilderness. Around us are all kinds of huts made of clay with roofs made out of sheets of corrugated iron. We have arrived in the shadow lands. In this border area between the civilized world and rubbish dumps, some houses are built, but they're more like hovels, in terrible condition. Chimneys spit smoke: Can there be anyone living here? It seems as if life has stopped here, but a toddler looks at us, barefoot and with big black eyes, like a little deer, on the alert. Here we are, visiting a Roma camp in Ukraine.'

middle-aged woman walks toward us. She is happy with the new water pumps which we have just put in. Her husband is waiting. Now, his pipe in his mouth and wearing a worn-out jacket, he dances in a circle on the new asphalt road. A song rings out from the school. The children are happy. Everybody is happy with the new road, the water-pumps and the school

building. When we walk through the camp we

see new small houses. Thanks to a group of

young people from Eindhoven, Holland, we

were able to take these big steps to partly fulfil

the dream of the total transformation of Janosi!

For these activities there were some years of preparation. First a relationship of trust had to be built. Now, the activities follow very quickly. These are not without difficulties but surely dynamic. We have a relationship, and

that is the basis. Now, in the camp, the desire is growing to see more changes for the better. They want to accomplish something themselves. Here and there men proudly show us they have started to renovate their homes!

THE GOD IN THE MANGER

Some years ago, in order to top up what the Church was paying me and not be a financial burden to the congregation who paid their tithes, I became an early morning cleaner. One of the establishments which I cleaned was the local technical college. One morning I was sent to clean the carpenters' shop where apprentices trained. When I first walked in, very early, I was met with the deliciously pungent smell of new wood. Something immediately struck me - Jesus was a carpenter and he would have known this smell. Moreover he would recognise many of the tools that probably remain unchanged - a hammer and nails can't be very different even after two thousand years, likewise chisels and saws. Screws had not been invented but, otherwise, Jesus would be at home. Jesus was a craftsman, a creator - "All things were made by him and without him was not anything made that was made", (John1:3). Yes! The craftsman who fitted the world and all that is in it together, shaped wood, handled tools, and worked on building sites and in the workshop. Did the King of Kings and Lord of Lords get splinters in his fingers? (How cruel it was at Calvary - to drive nails through the hands of a craftsman!)

At Christmas, we Christians celebrate the baby Jesus and think of the story of his birth. Christianity is an incarnational faith, by which we mean that it revolves around the fact that God became man; he "... was made flesh and dwelt among us." (John1:14). This makes Christianity unique among the world's religions. It is also a thing of great wonderment that, in Jesus, the divine came into the world through the same (let's be blunt!) messy and undignified route that the rest of us took - through a human mother. And yet, as a father (and a grandfather) I can testify that, despite the crudity of birth, a new baby is a wonderful thing and a time for outright joy and happiness.

Jesus was born into poverty; his cradle was a feeding-trough. He dwelt, not (as the wise men wrongly assumed) in a splendid palace surrounded by obscene wealth but amongst the ordinary people of his world. He was not head of a vast empire with whole armies to do his bidding but a village joiner in a country under cruel enemy occupation. His birth was announced, not in the media but in Heaven, and celebrated by shepherds, (a class held in such low esteem that their evidence was not admissible in court). The infant Jesus was God learning how to walk, eat and drink, live in a family, learn a trade.

December 25th, was originally a satanic festival celebrating the Lord of Misrule when the world is turned upside down. But Christians celebrate the One who came into the world to turn it the right way up! So, as we enjoy ourselves this Christmas, among the tinsel and fairy-lights, let us remember the manger with thankful hearts!

If we do good, we have nothing to fear from the NSA, and if our privacy is abused, let's remind ourselves what they did to the Son of God! In the Ukraine live many children that are left alone. Nobody really cares for them. Many families are subject to poverty and alcohol. Our desire is that these children will get to know the Lord Jesus Christ in a personal way, so we organize different programs every week in Roma communities, Children's Homes and boarding schools. Viki Antal is the woman behind these beautiful projects. Here she shares some stories about the children she works with in Kerestur, a village not far from the Hungarian border.

Boarding School in Kerestur

Kerestur is a place where you cannot remain indifferent! Children with physical and mental disabilities live together with those who are totally healthy.

Kerestur is the special school for mentally and physically handicapped children, from 6 to 17 years of age. Here you can meet with autism, Downs Syndrome, learning difficulties, cerebral spastic infantile paralysis, etc. and children who were born into dysfunc-

tional or alcoholic families.

I have been visiting this place for 8-9 years; every Tuesday I come to tell about the love of Christ. I begin with the smallest children, and talk to them through puppets.

Rostik

Rostik has Down Syndrome. At first Rostik shouted and put his hands over his ears, sat in a corner and was afraid to look at us. The

teacher explained the boy had experienced a trauma and now he is afraid of adults. But in one month the boy no longer had to leave the class. Later he sat with the others at a table, and was taking part. This was big

Here you will meet smiling children and would never assume that behind each life there is a family tragedy.

Sexual abuse

Eva is 12. She always comes and hugs me, but when I want to stroke her face, she suddenly jerks away in fear. Later the director explained why she reacts like this. He brought the girl from a neighbouring village. What he saw shocked him.

He found the house almost empty, with a few pieces of wrecked furniture. The electricity was cut off, the windows covered with newspaper, the house dirty and stinking. Eva slept in a dirty bed, next to a drunk old man. The neighbours reported the alcoholic mother's negligence. Later the police were also called in, because Eva said that her mother forced her to sleep with men, who paid with alcohol and seldom by cash. Sadly, at the police station, the mother did not show any remorse. She is now in jail with a 6 year sentence. Last time when we prayed, Eva asked me to pray for her mother.

Living in a pigsty

Olga (7) and Misha (6) are a sister and brother, who are always together, holding each other's hands. The boy is autistic. When child-safety men appeared at their house, there was a terrible smell. The parents were drunk and asleep. When they finally woke up, the mother gestured toward the back yard. The children were living in a pigsty and slept on a dirty blanket. No-one could tell how long they had lived there.

This mother received a three year sentence. Olga and Misha could not speak. Now the girl can speak a little, but Misha not at all. I found it important to share this story that all of you might gain insight into the plight of these children. I believe that Jesus can heal their lives. He does not look at them as though they are a mistake. He wants to give them new life – a better life!
